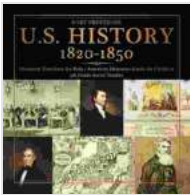

### 1820

- Missouri Compromise: This compromise admitted Missouri as a slave state and Maine as a free state, and it also drew a line at 36°30' north latitude, prohibiting slavery in the territories north of the line and allowing it in the territories south of the line.

## **1821**

## **1828**

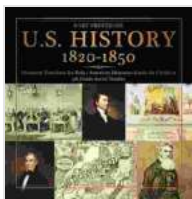
- Election of 1828: This election was won by Andrew Jackson, who was the seventh president of the United States, and he served from 1829 to 1837.

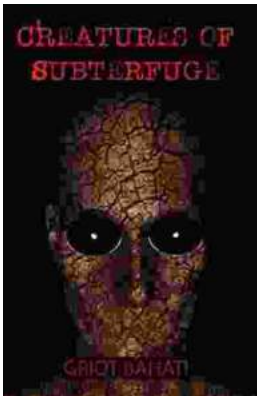
